Stone Canyon Summer Camp will operate under guidelines set by the following organizations and governing bodies:

<u>EH&E</u>: The American Camp Association(ACA) in partnership with The Y have come up with educational resources and guidelines for summer camps. These resources have been developed by an independent panel of experts coordinated by Environmental Health and Engineering (EH&E)

<u>CDC</u>: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

OEC: Colorado - Office of Early Childhood

<u>CDPH&E:</u> Colorado Department of Health and Environment

Note: These guidelines have last been updated June 23rd, 2020. Stone Canyon will continue to update these guidelines throughout the summer to ensure best safety practices are being followed. These updates will be based on and updates provided by the organizations and governing bodies listed above

	Under Current "Stay at Home Orders": Section 1 Keep COVID-19 OUT
Screening	 Pre-arrival, self-screening: <u>EH&E</u>: Staff and Campers will be asked to self pre-screen using a written record before arriving for symptoms and contact risks. Stone Canyon strongly recommends that campers quarantine as best as possible in the week leading up to camp. Campers are encouraged to wear a mask when interacting with anyone outside of their immediate family. It is also strongly encouraged that our campers do not travel outside of the state in the week leading up to camp. Negative COVID test: Campers must have proof of a negative COVID test within 72 hours of the first day of camp. Arrival Health Screening/Intake Health Screenings: CDC/ACA Parents/Guardians, Staff and Campers will undergo Arrival Health Screening any time. Per OEC these screenings could (potentially) be done at home by the parents. Schedule staggered arrive times to allow for screening and social distancing.
Guidelines	 Visitors: Non-essential visitors will not be allowed to visit camp/programs during this phase Communication with Public Health Authorities: <u>EH&E:</u> Camps will ensure timely and accurate reporting to the Colorado CDC for all notifiable diseases and conditions, including COVID. Signage: <u>EH&E, CDC, WHO</u> Energize Colorado Resources, appropriate signage will be posted in Dining Hall, Restrooms, Vehicles, pick up/Drop off Areas, etc Vendor Communication: Communication will be provided that during Resident Camp, vendor's access to camp will be restricted through reduced frequency, requesting consistent delivery personnel, and requiring that during visits they observe physical distancing, use of appropriate PPE and complete and Arrival Health Screening.

	• Vulnerable Populations: <u>EH&E</u> and <u>White House Guidance</u> , Staff and campers that are considered to be at-risk individuals must seek written approval from their Physician before being permitted at camp.

Educating Employees	 Staff Training: All staff will get detailed training to cover all of the guidelines outlined in this document, including procedures around screening, hygiene/handwashing, PPE (including proper use, removal and washing of facial covering), and distancing. Staff training will begin on May 30th and staff will be quarantined onsite for two weeks until campers arrive Sick Leave: Staff must not work if they are feeling sick, have had a known exposure to COVID-19, or have any active signs/symptoms of COVID-19
Educating Parents and Campers	 Handwashing: All campers and staff are required to thoroughly wash their hands with soap and water: Upon the start of each day at camp, before and after any meal, after sneezing, after using the restroom, at the end of the camp day, upon entering an indoor space, after touching frequently touched surfaces, and after using common items such as sports equipment. Staff as Educators: Staff will serve as health educators to all campers, reviewing: The correct "20 second" protocol for hand washing. How to sneeze into their elbow How to avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth, and face coverings. No sharing of any gear or personal items including food. Pre-Camp Communication: Parents will receive the policies contained herein and various other COVID-19 education.
Physical Distancing	 Group Size: Per the current <u>OEC</u> guidelines, group size will be limited to 10 campers, not including staff. If outdoors group sizes can exceed to 25 campers, not including staff. During this current Phase, best efforts will be made to eliminate contact between groups during activities and meals. Cabin Time: (CDPH&E) Bunk Beds will be 6 feet apart and campers will sleep opposite (alternate head to foot/foot to head). In the cabins (if space allows) there can be more than one established group of campers. Physical Distancing: At all times travel, meals, and activities campers and staff will remain 6 feet apart. If campers and staff are not able to physically distance masks will be required. General Activities: Per <u>EH&E</u>, holding activities outdoors as much as possible is recommended. Campers and staff should wear cloth face coverings during indoor activities when maintaining physical distancing is not feasible due to area limitations. When selecting sports and physical activities, camper groups should be

	maintained. Groups should maintain physical distancing at activities from other groups. Face masks should be readily provided by the camp and worn by counselors and staff whenever interacting with others outside their groups at a distance closer than six feet. Campers will be asked to bring their own face covering to use. Camps will have extra face coverings for any child who did not bring their own.
Enhanced Cleaning	 Disinfecting: Surfaces and equipment will be disinfected using <u>EAP approved</u> solutions, and <u>EH&E</u> recommended procedures. Staff will sanitize materials and gear before and after use. Whenever possible gear will be assigned to a camper for the entire program. If equipment is used by multiple campers at once it will be disinfected at the end of the activity and all campers will wash their hands when the activity has ended. Vehicle Transportation: If parents are carpooling with other families Stone Canyon recommends that everyone wears a facemask while in the vehicle together Common Spaces: Common spaces will be cleaned and disinfected between uses by different groups and whenever possible, assigned to individual groups.
Adjusted Operations	 Camp Store: Our camp store will operate in accordance with <u>EH&E guidelines</u>, emphasizing physical distancing and disinfecting guidelines. Drop off and Pick up: Schedule and pre-communicate that groups of campers are to be dropped off and picked up during staggered timeframes to support social distancing. Campers are to wash hands or use hand sanitizer upon drop off. Only one family member can be at drop off and pick up. Transportation: Stone Canyon will not provide transportation this summer Health Centers: All staff will wear face coverings when physical distancing cannot be maintained. PPE for health staff will be consistent with CDC guidelines for its use in suspected communicable disease including the consideration of N95, procedural masks and eye covering.
Food Service	 Dining locations: Groups will be assigned a location outdoors to eat lunch each day. If inclement weather rolls in groups will be assigned a separate indoor location to eat their lunch. Campers and staff will remain 6 ft apart while eating. Food Service: Prepackaged lunches will be served "to-go" and campers will transport their meals to an outdoor location. Campers may bring their own lunch from home. There will be no sharing of food between campers. Food service will be provided in alignment with EH&E guidelines. Handwashing: All campers must wash their hands with soap and water before getting their food for lunch. Masks: When entering the dining hall all campers must wear masks. Campers will sanitize their masks until they arrive at their assigned lunch area. When they arrive at the lunch area campers will sanitize their hands, then

	remove their masks (store their mask in their assigned zip lock mag), sanitize their hands again, and finally enjoy their lunch.

Clear Guidance	 Potential or Confirmed COVID-19: EH&E, immediate isolation will occur in the manor pre-defined in writing in the camp's communicable disease plan until appropriate return home transportation can be arranged. Parents must acquire a negative COVID test and clearance from a Doctor before the camper can return to camp. Mandatory Closure: If there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 the camp will close for a minimum of 24 hours. Inform Local Officials: If there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 Stone Canyon will contact Tri County Health Department and the Colorado Office of Early Childhood.
Contact Tracing	• Contact Tracing: As a. presumed or confirmed case is discovered, with the assistance of public health, the camp will work to determine if there were individuals outside of their group and assigned staff, that have been within six feet for more than 15 minutes, in the past days. Notification and increased surveillance and will be provided for these individuals and the group and their staff. Additional measures will be considered to assure that the group has no contact with the others for the next 14 days or until testing occurs.
